

Acting as the Economic Partnership for the South West of England

We have fortified partnerships with key organisations like the Institute of Chartered Accountants for England and Wales, Hydrogen South West, and the National Composites Centre, driving regional innovation and growth. We've also deepened our engagement with local universities and colleges, promoting the integration of academia and industry to develop talent and skills.

Our strategic conferences have addressed critical topics such as social mobility, cybersecurity, and artificial intelligence, generating national attention and promoting discourse across the region. Key collaborations included facilitating discussions on smart marine platforms between the University of Plymouth and the University of Bristol.

We continue to champion the technology sector through our sponsorship of the Tech South West Awards and the Grand BAME Gala Awards. In partnership with Business West, we tackled broad strategic challenges, ensuring the South West remains a dynamic hub of economic activity.



Training, Learning and Skills Development

By deepening our partnership with universities and colleges to align educational programmes with industry needs, we can ensure a robust pipeline of skilled talent for the region.

Our board members actively participate on academic boards, fostering strategic exchanges that shape responsive and forward-thinking curricula. This included our involvement in the South Devon College's Skills Summit, where we highlighted emerging sectors like Floating Offshore Wind and Hydrogen.



By expanding the Young Enterprise's Inspiring Futures programme we have been able to further educational opportunities in underserved communities. We also collaborated with the Police and Crime Commissioners and the Home Office on projects providing meaningful skills development for offenders, such as sustainable housing construction.

Our new role on the board of the Exeter Science Centre supports the creation of a science-focused educational network, enhancing regional scientific capabilities and education.

Development of Commercial Opportunities for the Clean Growth Agenda

SWBC actively supports the integration of economic growth with environmental sustainability. We have played a pivotal role in aiding Floating Offshore Wind (FLOW) projects in the Celtic Sea, enhancing their ability to secure business and integrate into regional economic strategies. These efforts extend to examining how these projects can advance the aims of the North Devon Biosphere, ensuring that economic activities complement environmental conservation.

In the hydrogen sector, our efforts have been centred on linking hydrogen producers with potential off-takers, particularly in maritime and logistics applications. Our partnership with Hydrogen South West has been vital in fostering a robust market for hydrogen as a clean energy source.

We supported the Crown Estate's sustainable development ambitions and explored innovative initiatives like marine carbon sequestration, aligning them with desalination projects to maximise environmental benefits. Additionally, we are aiding companies engaged in concrete decarbonisation, helping them to adopt sustainable practices and grow within the green economy.



Promotion and Support of Trade Mission Opportunities

This year, we have intensified our efforts to bolster trade mission opportunities, enhancing both economic growth and international partnerships.

One highlight was our sponsorship of the Diversity Business Incubator's Annual Awards. This key event supports the enhancement of trade relations between the UK and other global territories, reinforcing our commitment to international trade development.

Additionally, we have proactively engaged with international investors, offering strategic support to help them establish and thrive in the South West. Our tailored assistance ensures these international projects are effectively integrated into our local economy, fostering growth and opening new opportunities for regional businesses.

Support of Inward Investment Opportunities

We effectively leverage our professional services network to enhance inward investment, particularly in energy transition and natural capital sectors. We've assisted members in accessing diverse funding sources to foster business growth across the South West.

We supported the Great South West's efforts to organise and deliver a compelling series of events at UK REiiF in Leeds. These events showcased the region's capabilities and potential to a national audience, further attracting interest and investment.

Our involvement with the Gravity project, especially around the new Agratas battery plant, has opened supply chain opportunities for local businesses with significant industrial developments.





Conferences and Networking Events

By organising and participating in a series of impactful conferences and networking events over the past year, we have fostered collaboration across key regional issues.

We partnered with the South West Mobility Commission to host a highly successful Social Mobility Conference, chaired by Sir Michael Barber. This event featured discussions led by Pennon Group, The Times and The University of Exeter, enhancing our understanding and strategies around social mobility.

Our focus on cutting-edge technology led us to organise a major conference on Artificial Intelligence, where then Shadow Minister for AI and IP, Matt Rodda, was the keynote speaker. This conference attracted widespread media attention, including coverage from BBC TV and Radio.

We also launched a series of networking lunches that brought together leaders from business, academia, local government, and the third sector to discuss ongoing economic developments within the region.

Our 2023 Annual Dinner at The Box in Plymouth gathered over 110 senior stakeholders and featured a keynote speech by Bridget Rosewell CBE from the National Infrastructure Commission, promoting dialogue on infrastructure and regional development.

Our 2024 Annual Dinner at the same cultural venue was held on the night of the general election and included a keynote speech from Vice Admiral Andrew Burns CB OBE, Fleet Commander of the Royal Navy.
